High Ropes (all elements including Zip Wire and Powerfan)

FIRE

In the event of a fire you should raise the alarm, get out, stay out and call the fire brigade.

Please ensure all of your group are aware of the fire evacuation procedures.

The fire assembly point for the whole site is at the flagpole in the centre of the field.

Only use fire fighting equipment to aid your escape - do not attempt to extinguish the fire.

FIRST AID

Each group is responsible for making their own first aid arrangements - appointing someone to co-ordinate first aid and holding an appropriate first aid kit. A first aid kit is available in the site office during office hours and site instructors usually carry activity first aid kits.

All incidents which specifically relate to the campsite must be reported to site staff at the earliest opportunity.
