



BRITISH BIRDS

Activity last approx. 1-1 ½ hours.

To set the theme: Complete the wordsearch puzzle and/or
List as many birds as possible that might appear in the garden and
around the camp site.

Think about what birds might eat – make a list.

Put bird seed and nuts out onto the bird tables and fill the feeders
Sit quietly in the bird hide or on the benches.

Watch and see which birds come into the garden.
Try and identify them using the posters and books available.

After a while:

Spend some time drawing your favourite birds and colour them in.
Add information about them using the information books in the resource centre.

Find out where the bird boxes are around the camp site. Perhaps you could add these
onto a map of the campsite.
Check out the nest cam in the camp site reception.

Resources available in the resource centre/wildlife garden: Books, posters, information
cards, seeds and nuts, bird feeders.

Suggested resources for the participants/organisers to bring: pencils, pens, colours, paper,
camera, downloaded campsite maps and wordsearches.
