

## CREEPY CRAWLIES

Activity last approx: 1 – 1 ½ hours.

To set the theme: Complete the wordsearch puzzle.  
Make up your own quiz.

Think about where you might find creepy crawlies – make a list.

Spend some time going around the wildlife garden and the camp site in general looking for insects.

If possible, carefully collect the insects and bring them back to the resource centre in the wildlife garden.

Look at the bugs and creepy crawlies carefully and try to identify them using the books, information cards and charts etc.

Draw pictures of the bugs and add the information about them next to the picture.

Put the bugs and creepy crawlies back to the spot where you found them.

Resources available in the resource centre/wildlife garden: Books, posters, information cards, quizzes.

Suggested resources for the participants/organisers to bring: pencils, pens, colours, paper, camera, downloaded wordsearch/quiz sheets, containers with lids, magnifying glass
